



Healthcare Affordability Policy Checklist

Polling data repeatedly shows that healthcare affordability is the number one issue that state residents, on both sides of the political aisle, want their policymakers to work on. This checklist identifies areas where Kentucky is doing well and areas where it can improve.

1. Extend Coverage to All Residents:	
Expand Medicaid to cover adults up to 138% of the federal poverty level.	√
 Provide high-quality, affordable coverage options for people whose incomes are too high to qualify for Medicaid, e.g., Basic Health Plan, reinsurance or augmented premium subsidies. 	X
Provide options for recent immigrants that don't qualify for the coverage above.	√
Conduct strong rate review of fully insured, private market options.	√-
2. Make Out-of-Pocket Costs Affordable:	
Protect patients from inadvertent surprise out-of-network medical bills.	X
Limit the availability of skimpy and confusing short-term, limited-duration health plans.	X
Waive or reduce cost-sharing for high-value services.	X
Require insurers in a state-based exchange to offer evidence-based standard plan designs.	X
