



93% of respondents said that they believe the government should require insurers to provide up-front cost estimates to consumers, including 93% of Republican respondents, 94% of Democrat respondents, and 91% of unaffiliated respondents.

92% of respondents agreed that the government should set standard prices for durgs to make them affordable, including 89% of Republican respondents, 94% of Democrat respondents, and 90% of unaffiliated respondents.

92% of respondents said that they believe the government should require drug companies to provide advanced written notice of price increases and information to justify those increases, including 89% of Republican respondents, 93% of Democrat respondents, and 92% of unaffiliated respondents.

93% of respondents said that they believe the government should ensure patients can't be charged out-of-network prices if they encounter an out-of-network provider through no fault of their own, including 94% of Republican respondents, 94% of Democrat respondents, and 92% of unaffiliated respondents.

90% of respondents said that they believe the government should create a Prescription Drug Affordability Board to examine the evidence and establish acceptable costs for drugs, including 85% of Republican respondents, 95% of Democrat respondents, and 88% of unaffiliated respondents.
