








91% of respondents said that they believe the government should show what a fair price would be for a procedure, including 92% of Republican respondents, 90% of Democrat respondents, and 93% of unaffiliated respondents.

91% of respondents agreed that the government should expand health insurance options so that everyone can afford quality coverage, including 86% of Republican respondents, 94% of Democrat respondents, and 93% of unaffiliated respondents.

89% of respondents said that they believe the government should require insurers to provide upfront cost estimates to consumers, including 87% of Republican respondents, 90% of Democrat respondents, and 89% of unaffiliated respondents.

87% of respondents said that they believe the government should create a Prescription Drug Affordability Board to examine the evidence and establish acceptable costs for drugs including 81% of Republican respondents, 91% of Democrat respondents, and 89% of unaffiliated respondents.

88% of respondents said that they believe the government should ensure the cost of widelyneeded vaccines are affordable for all, including 85% of Republican respondents, 90% of Democrat respondents, and 89% of unaffiliated respondents.
