

New Hampshire Respondents Struggle to Afford Health Care: Selected Results from the Consumer Health Care Experience State Survey

83% of respondents reported being "worried" or "very worried" about affording some aspect of health care in the future.

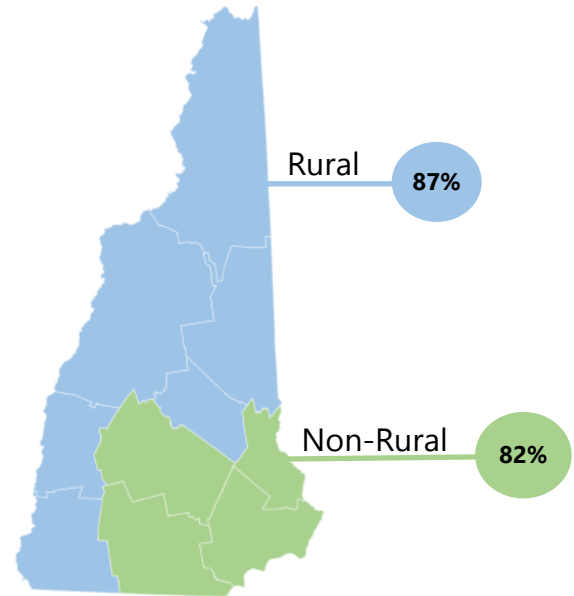


71% of respondents experienced at least one health care affordability burden in the past year.



69% of respondents reported delaying or going without health care due to cost in the last twelve months.

92% of respondents agreed that the government should cap out-of-pocket costs for life-saving medications, such as insulin, including 89% of Republican respondents, 97% of Democrat respondents, and 89% of unaffiliated respondents.

92% of respondents agreed that the government should require drug companies to provide advanced notice of price increases and information to justify those increases, including 90% of Republican respondents, 96% of Democrat respondents, and 92% of unaffiliated respondents.

92% of respondents agreed that the government should show what a fair price would be for a specific procedure, including 92% of Republican respondents, 95% of Democrat respondents, and 90% of unaffiliated respondents.

91% of respondents agreed that the government should expand health insurance options so that everyone can afford quality coverage, including 87% of Republican respondents, 97% of Democrat respondents, and 90% of unaffiliated respondents.

91% of respondents agreed that the government should make it easy to switch insurers if a health plan drops your doctor, including 91% of Republican respondents, 94% of Democrat respondents, and 90% of unaffiliated respondents.
