

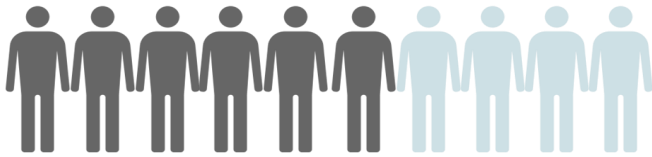
# Ohio Respondents Struggle to Afford Health Care: Selected Results from the Consumer Health Care Experience State Survey (CHES)



**80%** of respondents reported being "worried" or "very worried" about affording some aspect of health care

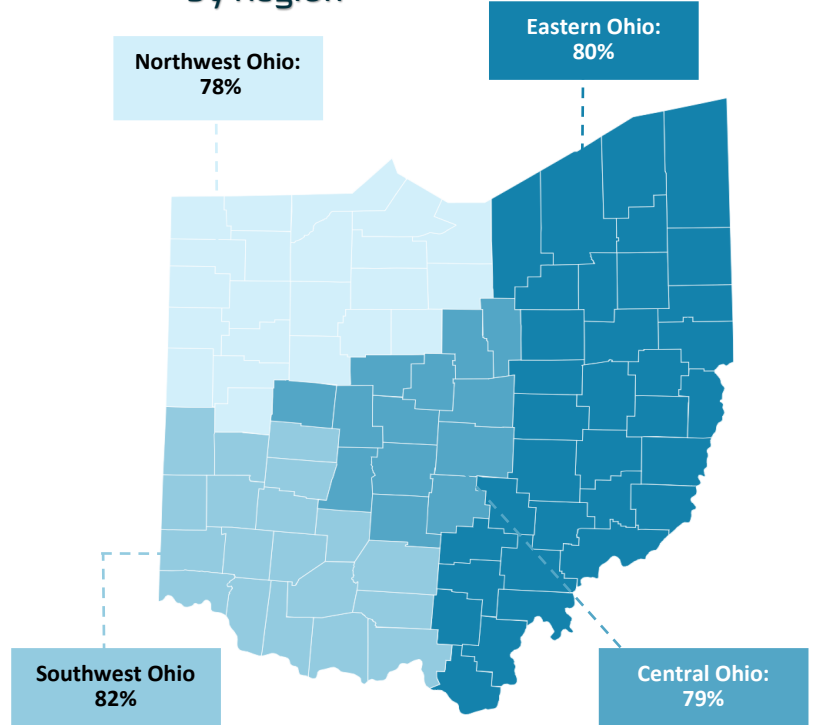


**69%** of respondents experienced at least one health care affordability burden in the past year.



**67%** of respondents reported delaying or going without health care due to cost in the last twelve months.

**91%** of respondents said that they believe the government should require hospitals and doctors to provide up-front patient cost estimates, including 92% of Republican respondents, 92% of Democrat respondents, and 90% of unaffiliated respondents.

**92%** of respondents agreed that the government should require drug companies to provide advanced notice of price increases and information to justify those increases, including 90% of Republican respondents, 95% of Democrat respondents, and 90% of unaffiliated

**91%** of respondents said that they believe the government should authorize the Attorney General to take legal action to prevent price gouging or unfair prescription drug price increases, including 86% of Republican respondents, 96% of Democrat respondents, and 90% of unaffiliated respondents.

**94%** of respondents said that they believe the government should show what a fair price would be for a specific procedure, including 92% of Republican respondents, 95% of Democrat respondents, and 94% of unaffiliated respondents.

**90%** of respondents said that they believe the government should cap out-of-pocket cost for life saving medications, such as insulin, including 87% of Republican respondents, 94% of Democrat respondents, and 90% of unaffiliated respondents.
