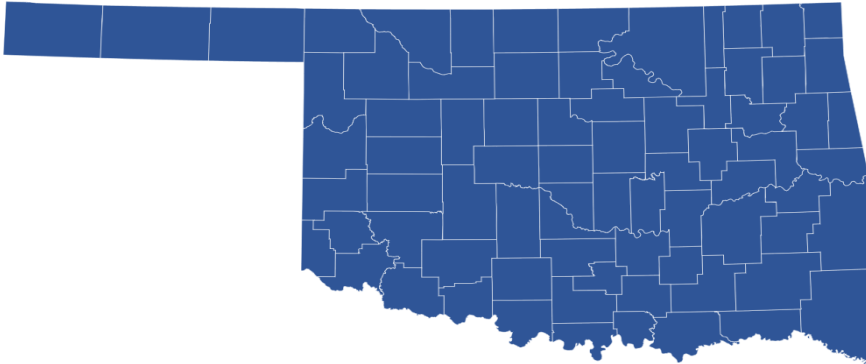


OKLAHOMA RESPONDENTS STRUGGLE TO AFFORD HEALTH CARE:

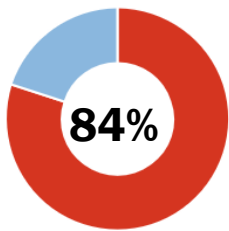

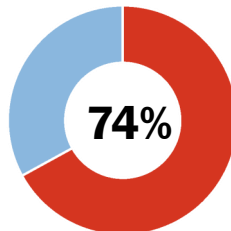


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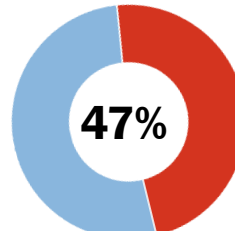
75% of Oklahomans reported experiencing worry about affording health care in the future.



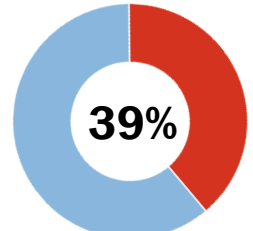
Percent of respondents who believe it should be easier for people to apply and renew their Medicaid coverage.
